Obamacare Sparks Government Shutdown

Last Monday night, on September 30, Congress found itself in a very sensitive situation between the Democrats and the Republicans. This situation came to a head last week due to disagreements on the Patient Protection

and Affordable Care Act (commonly known as Obamacare), a government policy that aims to provide access to discounted health care for all Americans. Obamacare allows for affordable health care, gives 19 to 25 year olds the ability to stay on their parents' health care, and permits those with pre-existing conditions to receive treatment,

with no prejudice towards gender or age.

However, Republicans oppose this policy due to the 2% tax increase for all who do not use it and the increase in prescription costs, amounting to an additional \$84.8 billion in fees over the next ten years (CNN). This policy already began to take effect, but

iOS 7 Delights Dougherty

Woodrow Wilson, the 28th President of the United States, once said, “If you want to make enemies, try to change something.” Certainly the folks at Microsoft would agree. When the software company replaced the popular Windows 7 operating system with Windows 8, the response from PC users everywhere was overwhelming negative. Apparently the tech giant listened because, on October 17, the company will release a free download of Windows 8.1 to current Windows 8.0 users.

Apple, maker of the world’s best-selling cell smartphone (the iPhone 5), is also facing a wave of consumer negativity—albeit on a lesser scale—after releasing its latest operating system, iOS 7. Apple’s iOS 7, released on Sept. 18, is used by the iPhone, iPad and iPod touch.

What are some of the new features in iOS 7? One of the biggest changes has to do with aesthetics. Colors are bolder and brighter. There is less shadowing and folders are more transparent. Users will notice more image motion as apps fly in and out; apps can now be closed with just a single upward swipe. Multitasking actually shows the screen of the app, not just its icon. The phone’s most frequently adjusted settings can be accessed with just a swipe up from the bottom of the screen. Siri sounds more human. With AirDrop, iPhone users can now share files with other iPhone users on the same network with just a single tap. The updated photo app makes it easier to search for old pictures. iTunes radio provides a station with a particular genre of music, and even includes a few free songs, refreshing the list from

time to time. Finally, the advanced security features such as fingerprint sensors, make the iPhone less desirable to thieves.

Of course Apple is absolutely glowing in their assessment of iOS 7. Not all users agree though. What do faithful DVHS iPhone users have to say about it?

According to the survey, more people love iOS 7 than hate it. 37.5% of the students that have iOS7 said that they loved it, while 25% acknowledged hating it. Another 37.5% neither loved or hated it, or had only a slight preference.

Why is it so common to have neutral feelings for the iOS7? Many of us find the bright colors almost garish, and the jittery motions and zoom animations somewhat dizzyingly nauseating. However, the concept of newness is always enticing. iTunes radio? Awesome. Control panel? Well, going through all the settings tabs was annoying. Multitasking? Niiiiice. Overall, iOS 7 has many awesome new features. But a burning question remains: Are these new features enough to tempt fellow DVHS Samsung Galaxy users to take another look at the iPhone...or at least subdue their contempt for “the other side”?

in a last attempt to halt it, an ultimatum was posed on Congress: delay Obamacare for one more year or face a partial shutdown of our government.

Tuesday morning, Congress was left in a deadlock, and when the clock struck midnight,

the government shutdown took effect on not only Congress but millions of families. Among other problems, this partial shutdown stops the FDA from performing almost all of its inspections, shuts down all national parks, delays payment to 1.4 million

active duty soldiers and temporarily fires over 800,000 government employee.
